### **DIVISION 3-YEAR EDUCATION PLAN APPROVAL**

The Board approved the 2024-2027 3-Year Education Plan for the division. The 3-Year Education Plan priorities were developed using the existing priorities, the ongoing review evidence of progress from the Annual Education Results Report, and feedback from staff, students and parents collected throughout the year in a variety of formats. Building off of the previous 3-Year Education Plan, the new plan identifies new strategies to continue the improvement seen over the previous 3 years in each of the three priority areas of Teaching and Learning, Belonging, and Leading.

### **DIVISION 2024 – 2025 BUDGET APPROVAL**

Norm Guindon presented to the Board the 2024 – 2025 Annual Budget Report for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2025, for approval. The budget is a deficit budget addressed through the planned use of reserves. Key messages include:

- The budget includes an increase of approximately 20 teachers
- The increase in revenue is from enrolment increases only, no increases in grant funding.
- No provision from the government for inflation pressures
